About the conference

The GeoPlace annual conference is an opportunity for around 400 address, street and geographic information experts from across the UK to come together to network; share information; and listen to a wide range of speakers who 'bring location to life' in their day-to-day work using address and street data.



The conference is a celebration of the work that you do on a day-to-day basis. Speakers will demonstrate how they use your local authority address and street data to:

- save lives in the fire and police services
- protect citizens and prevent fraud
- enable Streetworks notifications
- support utility works
- understand the location and proximity of local services to citizens
- analyse how effectively government policy is implemented
- collect Census data
- support council services in refuse and recycling, resolve day-to-day issues that affect citizens, provide tailored services to citizens, improve the services that people get from their council
- underpin the public rights of right network.

The theme of the conference is 'Bringing Location to Life', and this will be evident throughout the day; through the speakers' presentations, the solutions that suppliers promote on their stands, the visualisations created by GeoPlace and councils on the displayed media walls in the exhibition.

- **Camden Council** will demonstrate how the Camden Residents' Index exploits data that is held across multiple different council systems using the UPRN to gain new and predictive insights at a household level
- The Office for National Statistics will give an update on their use of address information to make a success of Census 2021
- **The London Fire Brigade** will demonstrate their innovative use of data science, including a recent project which highlighted the power of the UPRN
- **ITO World** will close the conference with a powerful demonstration showing how they're Bringing Location to Life. With visualisations from liveable cities to population demographics for Hyperloop, and from bike sharing to parking transactions the session will also showcase a new visualisation created especially for the conference using local authority address and street data.

The SNN Working Group will be available all day to talk with SNN Officers, offer help and support as well as run some practical session.

So, calling all SNN officers - If you have a problem, if you're struggling with streets and going postal with your plots and if no one else can help, come to this year's conference where maybe the SNN-PWG team is your answer.

This year's conference contains SNN workshops and drop-in surgeries with the team. Bring along any queries to a surgery or attend a practical hands-on workshop. Sections of a new SNN Code of Practice will be introduced at the workshop. This is a not to be missed opportunity!"

Focus on streets

The conference will host a parallel session focusing on street data. In the morning, the Department for Transport will provide an update on Street Manager, the new digital service



for raising Streetworks notifications, with a particular emphasis on how it will interact with and display the NSG and ASD. In a further session the DfT will also discuss its local data action plan, highlighting the importance of local data at a national level.

The afternoon session will look at 'street data in action' with a speaker from Devon County Council outlining how it has utilised Microsoft's Power BI in order to analyse Budgets, Street Works, Enquires and any other aspect of the vast quantity of data we hold within Highways and present the findings in a layout tailored to requirements of the end user. Following an analysis of the NSG, a speaker from ADEPT will focus on the opportunities and benefits of including PROW with in the NSG.

On-site support and training

GeoPlace support sessions will take place throughout the day in the Data Zone within the exhibition room including:

- Helpdesk 1-2-1 session
- Data clinic

Recognising the importance of the content, the AGI and Royal Geographical Society have both accredited the conference with 4 and 5 CPD points respectively.
