
SNN is the **official process** carried out under legislation by local authorities to name streets and assign property numbers. It ensures every address is unique, consistent, and easy to locate – whether for postal deliveries, emergency services, planning, or utilities.

When SNN is done well, it benefits everyone:

- Emergency services can locate callouts quickly and easily.
- Local authorities can keep their systems up to date, helping services like waste collection, social care, and council tax run smoothly.

- Residents experience smoother deliveries, faster service responses, and fewer everyday frustrations.
- Developers can avoid costly delays by ensuring new properties are named and numbered correctly from the start.
- Street and building names tell the story of a place its character, its history, and its people.








Accurate addresses power smarter, safer communities.

SNN officers give every street its official identity. It's a legal obligation.



Every service starts with an address.

From bin collections to emergency services, if the address isn't right, the service doesn't reach the right place



Emergency services depend on SNN

 accurate street naming and numbering ensures police, fire and ambulance services can reach people quickly in an emergency

New housing, commercial buildings, and infrastructure projects cannot function without SNN creating official addresses






Local authorities are legally required to name and number streets and properties. Without this, properties couldn't be officially recognised or recorded

If a property isn't correctly named or numbered, emergency services risk losing precious minutes finding the location



SNN Officers don't just manage data, they shape the heritage of place names that last for generations



If addresses aren't correct,

citizens can miss council tax bills, health appointments, or voting information



Accurate property data

could help identify isolated households or vulnerable residents faster, supporting safeguarding and outreach

A single mistake in street naming and numbering can ripple through multiple systems, causing delays, extra costs, and loss of trust
