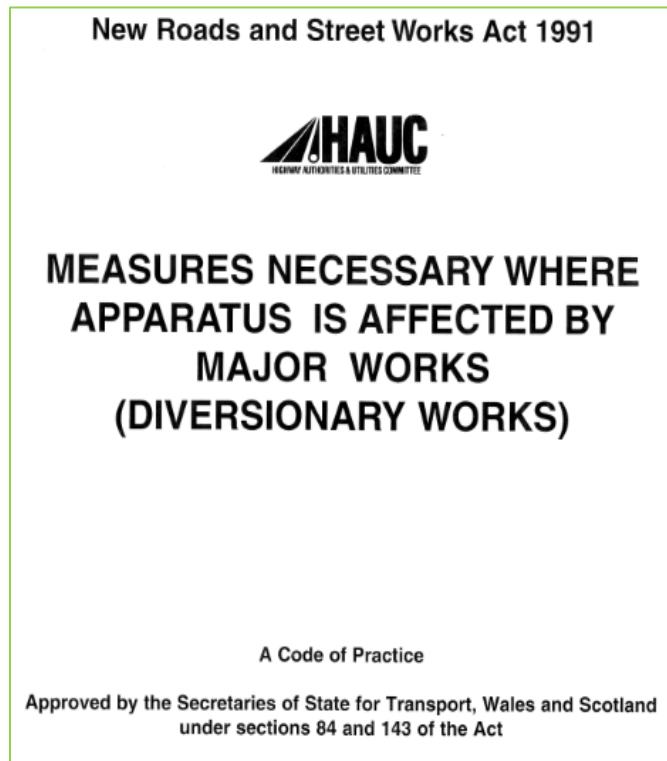
HAUC (UK) Diversionary Works Working Group - Our Purpose:

Diversionsary Works - The Way Forward

The Code Review



The code of practice:

Released in June 1992 & provides the procedures for conducting diversionary works and supports best practice

Recently conducted a complete a review and update of the code of practice (measures necessary where apparatus is affected by major works)

Update the code to reflect modern working practices and provide clearer understanding

Work towards achieving one consistent version of the code to be applied across England, Wales and Scotland

Supplement the revised code with a new HAUC Operational Guidance document and withdraw the 2010/1 HAUC Advice Note.
