History of Lane Rental



• 2012 Regulations and original DfT Guidance (S74a of NRSWA '91)

- Up to £2500 daily charge for works on busiest streets
- MUST be applied to both roadworks and streetworks (DfT Guidance only)
- Net income (minus scheme operation and evaluation costs) ring fenced as 'LR Surplus funds'
- 2012/2013 : Pioneer schemes go live; Transport for London and Kent CC
- 2016 Ecorys LR report for DfT published
- 2018 : Revised DfT Guidance and amended regulations
- April 2021 : Surrey CC scheme commenced
- Dec 2022 : West Sussex CC scheme commenced
- March 2024 Latest DfT guidance
- 2024 DfT consultation : Street works: fines and lane rental surplus funds outcome GOV.UK
- Feb 2025 DfT consultation on future scheme approvals closes
- April 2025 : East Sussex CC scheme commenced
- TBC (mid April?) 2025 : Latest DfT Guidance for LHAs on scheme development/submission
- Numerous schemes now in development across England.....don't forget governance considerations!







It's in the DFT Guidance!

Sets out a focus for how surplus funding will be spent

"...*to reduce the disruption or other adverse effects arising because of street works*" (and roadworks)

Develops the application process

Meets legislative/constitutional requirements, such as : • Subsidy Control Act 2022 • Procurement Act 2023 • Public Procurement Regs 2015

Legal Teams' considerations (inc. Ts and Cs)

Does governance = red tape/bureaucracy? Potentially...?








The Application Process

- It's all about the idea!
- Contact the board to have an initial discussion and find a sponsor
- Develop the application with your sponsor and then submit
- Applications are scored to assist with decision making
- Dragons den time present at board then Q&A
- Board votes slight difference in process here





Approved applications – West Sussex

- Governance process developed alongside scheme operation
- Started considering bids in late 2024 once surplus funds established
- "The West Sussex Exceptional Fund"
- Opportunity to fund additional measures during or after works
- Targeted at mid to long-term emergency works or shorter term planned works
- Fund available for utility promoters
- Aim is to make 'Good' become 'Great'
- Lane rental scheme West Sussex County Council


Surrey Lane Rental Scheme (SLRS) - Surrey County Council
